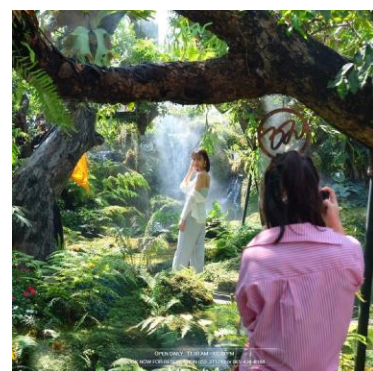
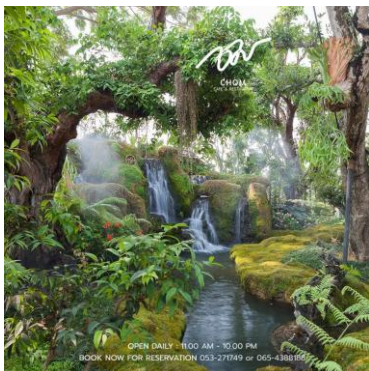
DAY 1: Chiang Mai – Temple on the Hill – Local Test Dinner Recommend **Morning:**

Arrival at Chiang Mai Airport. Immigration clearance and transfer to City

Lunch:

Chom Cafe and Restaurant (Thai Select 2-Star Restaurant Award)

a renowned "fairytale" destination famous for its lush, mist-covered Tropical Thai Moss Garden, waterfalls, and koi ponds. The garden uses artificial mist to create a "forest fantasy" atmosphere. Visit just before sunset for the best lighting and consider wearing white or light-colored clothing to stand out against the greenery. The restaurant serves a mix of authentic Thai cuisine, fusion dishes, and Western options.



Afternoon:

Temple on the hill – Wat Phra That Doi Suthep, iconic temple in Chiang Mai, perched on the mountain that shares its name. Known for its shimmering golden pagoda and panoramic views of the city, it is a "must-visit" for any traveler in the region.



Wat Pha Lat, often called the "hidden temple" or the "temple at the sloping rock," is a serene Buddhist monastery tucked into the lush jungle on the slopes of Doi Suthep. Founded in the 14th century

It offers open-air, lakeside seating with views of the surrounding mountains and Chiang Mai city below

DAY 2: Doi Inthanon Nature Park – Pha Dok Sieo Nature Trail -Best Pizza In Town

Morning:

Depart from Hotel

Doi Inthanon Nature Park and The Royal Grand Pagodas : known as "The Roof of Thailand," is home to the country's highest peak at 2,565 metres. The park is famous for its cool climate, diverse hiking trails, and the majestic Twin Royal Pagodas. The officially named Phra Maha Dhatu Nabha Metaneedol and Nabhapol Bhumisiri, were built by the Royal Thai Air Force to honor the 60th birthday anniversaries of King Bhumibol Adulyadej and Queen Sirikit. They are surrounded by meticulously landscaped flower gardens. Visitors can use escalators to reach the top level, though the descent is via stairs.

Restaurant: Nature park Restaurant

Afternoon:

PHA DOK SIEO NATURE TRAIL: a scenic, moderate-level trek located within Doi Inthanon National Park in Chiang Mai, Thailand. The trail is renowned for its 7-tier Pha Dok Sieo Waterfall, lush rainforests, and terraced rice paddies.



Wachirathan Falls (also known as Diamond Creek Falls) : is a powerful, multi-tiered waterfall located in Doi Inthanon National Park, Plunging roughly 80 metres down a granite escarpment, it is celebrated as one of the most majestic and accessible waterfalls in northern Thailand.

Dinner: Amataros Sourdough Pizza

Simply the best sourdough pizza in Chiang Mai. Hidden gem restaurant with Mountain view. Offers a delightful culinary experience rooted in authentic Italian traditions. With a focus on fresh, high-quality ingredients, this eatery excels in crafting artisanal sourdough pizzas, pasta, and Mediterranean dishes. DAY 3: Heart of Chiang Mai – Traditional Kantoke Dinner

Morning:

Depart from Hotel

Wat Phra Singh Temple: is one of the most historically significant and visually stunning Buddhist temples in Northern Thailand. Located in the heart of Chiang Mai's Old City, it is a prime example of classic Lanna architecture and remains an active spiritual center where over 700 monks and novices live.



Wat Chedi Luang Temple: known as the "Temple of the Great Stupa," is one of the most important and visually striking Buddhist temples in the heart of Chiang Mai's Old City. Built in the 14th century, it was once the tallest structure in the Lanna Kingdom, reaching heights of around 80 meters before a massive earthquake in 1545 destroyed its upper portion. Today, the partially ruined but still massive brick chedi remains a powerful symbol of the city's rich history and architectural heritage.



Lunch: Jia Tong Heng Restaurant

legendary Chinese restaurant in Chiang Mai, renowned for its traditional Teochew and Cantonese cuisine since 1957. It is a popular choice for large family gatherings and business meals due to its extensive menu and consistent quality.



Afternoon:

Wat Sri Don Moon Temple: is a tranquil Lanna-style Buddhist temple located in the Saraphi District, approximately 20 km southeast of Chiang Mai's Old City. It is primarily known for its association with the revered monk Kruba Noi Techapanyo, its striking white and gold architecture, and its peaceful atmosphere away from major tourist crowds



The Bo Sang Umbrella Village: located about 10–12 kilometres east of Chiang Mai city, is a world-renowned handicraft hub famous for its traditional handmade paper parasols. You can visit the Umbrella Making Centre to watch the entire production process—from carving bamboo frames to hand-painting intricate floral and landscape designs.



Evening

Original Khantoke Dinner: a tradition dating back to 1971. It combines an authentic Northern Thai (Lanna) feast with a series of traditional music and dance performances. Food is served on a Khantoke, a low, round teak or bamboo table. You typically sit on floor cushions, though western-style table seating is often available for an extra fee or by request.



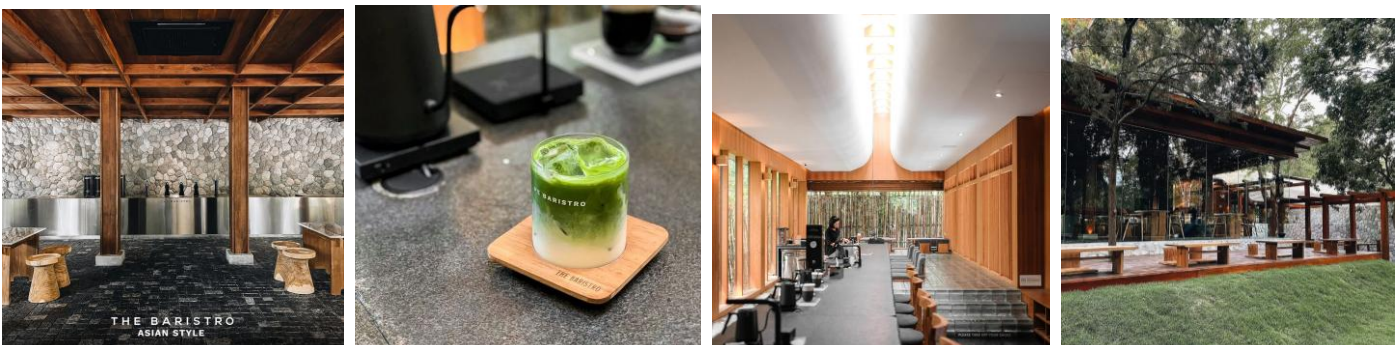

DAY 4: Morning Market –Hidden Temple – Michelin Guide Cuisine-Shopping **Morning: Check-out from Hotel**

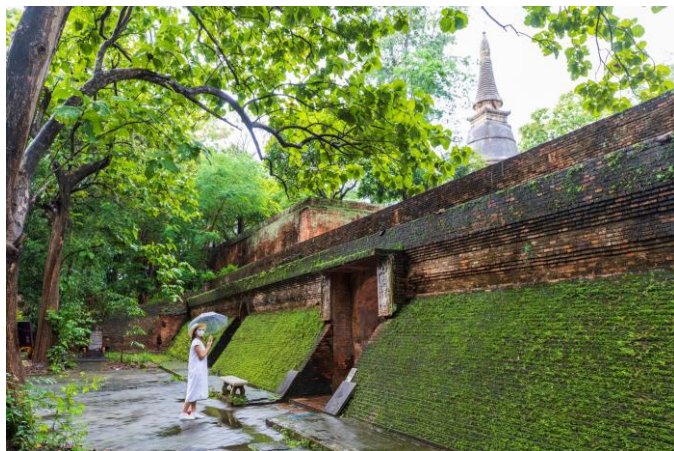
Ton Phayom Fresh Market: bustling local market in Chiang Mai known for its authentic Northern Thai food, fresh produce, and a wide array of local snacks and souvenirs. It provides an immersive experience into the local culture and cuisine.



The Baristro Asian Style: a standout destination in Chiang Mai's thriving cafe scene, renowned for its serene Japanese Zen and Lanna-inspired architecture. Located behind Chiang Mai University, it offers a tranquil retreat that blends minimalist aesthetics with a high-end coffee and matcha experience.



Wat Umong 700 years tunnel Temple: is a 700-year-old "tunnel temple" in Chiang Mai, , built in 1296 by King Meng Rai. Situated at the foot of Doi Suthep, it is famous for its ancient, moss-covered tunnels, serene forested, "jungle" setting, and active meditation center. Key features include a large stupa, historic Buddha images, and "talking trees" with philosophical quotes.



Lunch: Kiew Kai Ka at One Nimman: Thai restaurant in Chiang Mai, frequently recommended for its refined, it has been featured in the Michelin Guide for seven consecutive years (2018–2024), recognized for high-quality ingredients and authentic flavors.

Free and Easy: Shopping One Nimman Market and Maya Shopping Mall

The European style One Nimman Shopping Area has a couple of cute markets that both take place. MAYA Lifestyle Shopping Center is a modern, six-floor landmark in Chiang Mai's Nimman district, known for its distinctive lattice-work architecture. It serves as a major hub for fashion, dining, and late-night social life.
